# CANADA'S POSTMARK 'GOLDEN AGE' 1896-1902



28 JUNE 1897: Three-Color 'Queen Victoria Jubilee" Issue on Montreal Hotel Cover to Albany, New York, 6-Cents Double-Weight Letter-Rate to U.S.A. Imperial Machine Jubilee Celebration Postmark.

#### BACKGROUND

Soon after the introduction of adhesive postage in Canada in 1851, the postal authorities recognized that their method of double-strike postmarking mail was time consuming and inefficient resulting in their introduction of duplex postmarks.

With the increase in business and civilian mail volume by the mid-1890s, still more expeditious mail handling was needed as recognized in the neighboring United States of America with their wide introduction of postmarking machinery. Such motivated the Canadian Post Office to decide to test and introduce postmarking machinery in their domain.

Double-Strike Hand Cancels 1851- circa 1860

Upon introduction of adhesive postage stamps in Canada in 1851, THE POSTAL AUTHORITIES REQUIRED LETTER MAIL TO HAVE SUCH MAIL DOUBLE-STRUCK POSTMARKED:

Obliterator (concentric rings with/without city reference number) for the postage and a separate strike with city & date.

Duplex Hand Cancels First Generation Design

1860 - 1890s

Double-strike postmarking was eventually recognized as time consuming and inefficient by the postal authorities.

WHILE VISITING ENGLAND IN 1859/1860, THE CANADIAN POSTMASTER GENERAL PLACED A PURCHASE ORDER FOR FIFTY-SIX HAND-HAMMER STAMPERS

with the Berri Company of London for their 'Duplex Postmarking Stampers', which had already been used in England for five years.

# Duplex Hand Cancels Second Generation Design 1870s – 1890s

Eventually the heretofore 'first generation small dater dial' version of the duplex post markers were altered to have a larger dater dial with enlarged obliterator.





## **Provisional Flag Cancels**

1870s - 1902

Occasionally a Canadian post office might not apply an origin or transit postmark on mail to cancel its postage or indicate transit function RESULTING IN THE TORONTO POST OFFICE APPLYING A ROLLER-CANCEL OR ARRIVAL-TRANSIT-MARK IN RED-VIOLET COLOR.

Postmark: 'Union jack' Flag Roller-Cancel in series to cancel postage, or single flag in hand-stamp indicating "Received" for transit mail.



Because of need to expedite the handling of mail, the Canadian Post Office decided to commence testing the Imperial Machine at Montreal.

Postmarks applied were patriotic in theme .. initially having lineobliterators followed with patriotic 'flag' types.







No records or reference materials have been found to explain the purpose of the 'K' Union Jack Postmark!

It is thus assumed by postal historians that it was a reserve die for use when one of the six machine postmarking dies needed replacing.

EXCEPT DURING THE PERIOD OF 3-9 SEPTEMBER 1896, NO OTHER USE IS KNOWN OR HAS BEEN VERIFIED. FOUR EXAMPLES KNOWN

Martin Ethridge, designer of the Imperial Machine, developed a new postmarking machine, superior in function to the Imperial, the 'BICKERDIKE' (named after his financier 'Robert Bickerdike'), which he, along with John Brooks Young, patented in Canada, the United States and Great Britain in 1896. To manufacture the machine, a new company was formed, the Canadian Postal Supply Company.

THE 'BICKERDIKE' WAS OFFERED TO THE CANADIAN POST OFFICE IN 1896 WITH SUCCESSFUL TESTING CONDUCTED BY THEM IN DECEMBER 1896.
