Single digits following postmark dial types and cancellation types represent metal die differences observed by Bob Payne.

Note: A 7-bar cancel was used at Jackson, Ohio from 1909-1920, and with a different die from 1923-1925. This is an American 7-bar cancel. For additional information on American 6 and 7 bar cancels, see Robert J. Payne, Anthology 7 (2002) at page 62. To compare a scan of the American 7-bar with the Universal 7-bar, see page 63 under the town of Kenton.

Most International cancels with a year at the bottom of the dial, will have a small tick in the dial just above their year slug. This horizontally curved mark has been shown by Bob Payne to be a consistent marking, and not stray ink. *See arrow in dial above.*

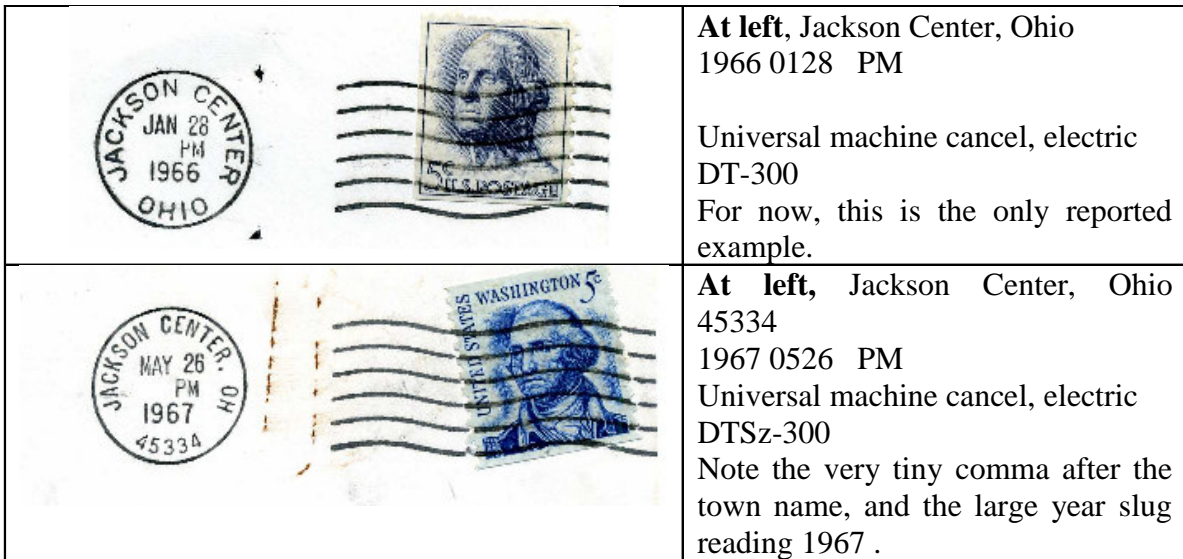


**Above:** Jackson, Ohio 1958 1022 Universal machine cancel used with double rimmed hand cancel on Special Delivery Mail.

Both the new DT 300 (with no zip code in dial) and the Earliest Known Use (EKU) for DTSz 300 (with zip code in dial) were found on envelope cut corners, 2x4. It would be a mistake to seek out only entire envelopes for machine cancels.



With a 1990 population of 1398, additional examples of Jackson Center with no zip code in dial should be available for the search.

Sometime between February 1, 1965, and January 11, 1966, the Jewett post office began using a postmark dial with a zip code in it. One of the goals of machine cancel postal history (mechano-marcophilately) is to record those dates.
